Unfortunately things get worse *Genesis 6v6-7*

But God is gracious *Genesis 6v8*

Maybe we can solve the sin problem if we just start again? *Genesis 9v1-3*

Oh wait...

Genesis 9v20-29 Genesis 8v21 (Romans 3v10-19)

But God is gracious ... BLESSINGS

The Partial Kingdom

SHUT UP?! 3 THE PROTOTYPE RELATIONSHIP Exodus 19-40

Revealing himself *Exodus 3v13-14, 34v5-7*

Dwelling with his people again *Exodus 25v8-9, v22, 40v34-38*

The sin problem: How can such a God dwell with sinful people?

2 part solution:

1. Law

Exodus 19v5, Leviticus 26v3-12, 26v14-22

2. Sacrifices

Leviticus 17v11 at-one-ment

Leviticus 16v7-10, 15-16, 20-22, 24, 30

Has the problem of sin been dealt with?

Exodus 32V1-4, V10, V13, V30, 33V3

They finally enter the land... *Joshua 1v1-3, 24v14, v15-16*

But, worryingly *Joshua 15v63, 16v10, 17v12-13 (given Exodus 23:31-33)*

And in Judges things get worse, as the following cycle develops:

- → Israel sin by serving idols
- → God punishes her by raising up enemies
- → Israel appeal to God for help
- → God raises up a deliverer or 'judge'
- → The judge dies
- → Israel sin by serving idols...

e.g. Judges 2v10-19

The cycle is actually more of a downward spiral

The Partial Kingdom (cont'd)

Recap: Turn to the last diagram

Judges 21v25

The sin problem will only be solved by a King

A King under God

Deuteronomy 17v14-20

But Israel wants one instead of God *1 Samuel 8v1-7*

Man's King Saul

1 Samuel 13v13-14, 15v9-11, v24, v28

God's King David

1 Samuel 13v14, 16v7, v12-13

2 Samuel 7v1

...is promised a better King David *2 Samuel 7v10-16*

SHUT UP?! 4

...before revealing that he's just another David *2 Samuel 11:2-4, 14-15*

Is Solomon the promised offspring?

3) The Return of the King

The final piece of the puzzle: The King is coming twice *Mark 8v27-33*

What Jesus did the first time

Freed us from the penalty of sin *Romans 3v21-25*1 Peter 3v18

Freed us from the power of sin *Romans 6*1 Peter 2v24

Brought us into a family relationship with God *John 20v17-18*

What will happen the second time

Universal judgment *Acts 17v31*

Unrepentant sinners punished *2 Thess 1v6-9*

Believers taken to be with Jesus *Mark 13v27*1 Thess 4v16

Their bodies recreated free from presence of sin & death *1 Corinthians 15v42-43*

The world recreated free from sin & death *2 Peter 3v10-13*


