Gospel going global—what's your role? (stewardship—films and discussion)

Film 1—Every village in India

The gospel changes lives forever, so start living radical, sacrificial lives for the sake of making Christ known.

"... it amazed me to see thousands and thousands of villages do not know Christ. Pepsi's there. Coca-cola reached, no Jesus... The thought that someone isn't being sent to an unreached village to plant a church for that much money. That's madness. That's crazy. That's the saddest thing I've ever heard."

"... maybe one of the big gifts that I've been given, which most people don't like to talk about, this is Britain, we hate to talk about money, maybe one of the big gifts I was given was access to wealth. And then the idea was simple, it was just earn money, give it away, don't keep it."

- 1. What have you been struck by in this film? Do you feel encouraged / challenged, or have any questions?
- 2. Compared to other charitable causes, how important is it to invest time, money and talent into the preaching of God's word? Why?

Thinking it through with...

- a) What are the key lessons you have learnt over the years about stewarding your resources to serve God outside of paid ministry?
- b) There are so many competing needs in the world how do you focus your giving?

Film 2: The Adventure of Faith

Everyone has a role to play in taking the gospel to all nations. It starts with knowing God's purposes, praying for opportunities, and asking to help.

God has given us a truth, it's his word that lasts forever. And God calls us to steward that, to share that, and to enable others to share that with the world... Even though we're right here he has a role for us to play in this global mission that's going on. And as we support, pray for, hold the other end of the rope for those who are on that front lines, we are playing a crucial role in God's kingdom work around the world.

- 1. What have you been struck by in this film? Do you feel encouraged / challenged, or have any questions?
- 2. How can we "Pray knowledgeably, Give specifically, Go intentionally"?

Thinking it through with...

- a) How do you view your role at work what do you think is God's purpose for you at work?
- b) What are some of the challenges of parting with your money? What helps you to continue overcoming them?

Further thoughts¹

- 1. **Prioritise godliness over money** God does not need your money. "May your silver perish with you, because you thought you could obtain the gift of God with money!" (Acts 8:20)
- 2. **Be sober-minded about where your gifts lie** Where has God placed you, and why has he placed you there? "And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?" (Esther 4:14)
- 3. **Know what your gifts are for** your talents and money are gifts for the kingdom of God. The temptation is to use them to feed your own glory, ambitions and comfort.
- 4. **It's not the quantity of your giving that counts what counts is whether it is sacrificial**. Don't think "I already give to gospel work, so I can do whatever I want with the rest of my money".
- 5. **Start early** don't think "I will work hard to save up now and give later" (also don't think "I will work hard to establish myself and then evangelise later"). Have a clear, deliberate and conscious **resolve** about what to do with money.

- 6. Guard against luxurious **lifestyle choices** it would be an astonishing witness if we lived with frugality (likely in contrast with those around us).²
- 7. Don't let your gospel patronage be **an extension of your pride**. Patronage is not the only aspect of your Christian service. Continue to serve in unseen, obscure ways. Remember who you are and why you are here. Ask God to give you **humility** appropriate to being a follower of Jesus Christ, the servant king.
- 8. God uses the former rebels, reborn, to be preachers and patrons. **Some** are called to be preachers and **many** others are called to be patrons. Pick up the cause.
