God's "blue tick" for the apostles



⇒ The New Testament is God introducing Himself to us in Jesus

"Long ago at many times and in many ways, God spoke..." (1:1, cf. 1:5-14)




⇒ The whole Bible is God introducing Himself to us, in Jesus

Keep a finger in Hebrews, and turn to Psalm 95:6-11 (p. 599).

- What is the big message to those hearing the Psalm?

Turn back to Hebrews 3:7-13 (p. 1205).

- What is being said to the readers of this letter?



⇒ The whole Bible is God *still* speaking to us, in Jesus


