# Life assured A meaningful death John 19:28–37

Introduction

(a royal death—Psalm 22)

## 1. A purposeful death

'It is finished'

Psalm 69:9 'the reproaches of those who reproach you have fallen on me' ...

20 '... reproaches have broken my heart ... '

21 '... they gave me poison for food, and for my thirst they gave me sour wine to drink'

#### 2. A definite death

'The Day of Preparation' = preparation for the Sabbath (ie Friday)

### 3. A sacrificial, sin-bearing death

Exodus 12:46 'it shall be eaten in one house; you shall not take any of the flesh outside the house, and you shall not break any of its bones'.

Zechariah 12:10 'when they look on me, on him whom they have pierced, they shall mourn for him, as one mourns for an only child ...'

Zechariah 13:1 'On that day there shall be a fountain opened for the house of David and the inhabitants of Jerusalem, to cleanse them from sin and uncleanness.'
